- 6. 9 warning signs that we might be falling in love with our money
- 7. 1. The desire to get money unjustly
 - a. "Woe to him who builds his realm by unjust gain to set his nest on high, to escape the clutches of ruin! Habakkuk 2:9
 - b. Food gained by fraud tastes sweet to a man, but he ends up with a mouth full of gravel. Proverbs 20:17
- 8. 2. Refusal to help those in need
 - a. Do not withhold good from those who deserve it, when it is in your power to act. Do not say to your neighbor, "Come back later; I'll give it tomorrow"--when you now have it with you. Proverbs 3:27-28
- 9. 3. Discontentment
 - a. Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, because God has said, "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you."

- b. "As sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things." 2 Cor 6:10
- 10. 4. Not wanting to work for our money
 - The sluggard's craving will be the death of him, because his hands refuse to work. All day long he craves for more, but the righteous give without sparing. Proverbs 21:25-26
- 11. 5. Inordinate preoccupation with money
 - a. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows.

 1 Timothy 6:10 (NLT)
- 12. 6. Get rich quick attitude
 - Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." Luke 12:15
- 13. 7. Stinginess
 - a. A stingy man is eager to get rich and is unaware that poverty awaits him. Proverbs 28:22
- 14. 8. Entertaining bribes
 - a. Be careful that no one entices you by riches; do not let a large bribe turn you aside. Job 36:18
- 15. 9. Unwillingness to live on less than we make
 - a. Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God. Hebrews 13.16 (ESV)
- 16. 14 Consequences of falling in love with money
- 17. 1. We may choose the wrong priorities
 - a. And as he was setting out on his journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? No one is good except God alone. You know the commandments: 'Do not murder, Do not commit adultery, Do not steal, Do not bear false witness, Do not defraud, Honor your father and mother." And he said to him, "Teacher, all these I have kept from my youth." And Jesus, looking at him, loved him, and said to him, "You lack one thing: go, sell all that you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow me." Disheartened by the saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. Mark 10:17-22 (ESV)
- 18. 2. It leads to all manner of evil
 - a. People who want to get rich fall into temptation and a trap and into many foolish and harmful desires that plunge men into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil. Some people, eager for money, have wandered from the faith and pierced themselves with many griefs. Tim 6:10 (ESV)
- 19. 3. It suffocates interest in spiritual things
 - a. And as for what fell among the thorns, they are those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by the cares and riches and pleasures of life, and their fruit does not mature. Luke 8:14 (ESV)

20. 4. It retards spiritual maturity

a. "This is the meaning of the parable: The seed is the word of God. Those along the path are the ones who hear, and then the devil comes and takes away the word from their hearts, so that they may not believe and be saved. Those on the rock are the ones who receive the word with joy when they hear it, but they have no root. They believe for a while, but in the time of testing they fall away. The seed that fell among thorns stands for those who hear, but as they go on their way they are choked by life's worries, riches and pleasures, and they do not mature. But the seed on good soil stands for those with a noble and good heart, who hear the word, retain it, and by persevering produce a crop. Luke 8:11-15

21. 5. We may be guilty of divided affections

a. "No one can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money. Matt 6:24

22. 6. It is a form of idolatry

23. 7. It is a form of adultery

a. You adulterous people, don't you know that friendship with the world is hatred toward God? Anyone who chooses to be a friend of the world becomes an enemy of God. James 4:4

24. 8. The love of the father is not in us

a. Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For everything in the world--the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does--comes not from the Father but from the world. 1 John 2:15-16

25. 9. It can lead to discontentment

a. Don't love money; be satisfied with what you have. For God has said, "I will never fail you. I will never abandon you." Heb 13:5 (NLT)

26. 10. It will never satisfy us

a. Those who love money will never have enough. How meaningless to think that wealth brings true happiness! Eccl 5:10

27. 11. It can destroy us

a. But people who long to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many foolish and harmful desires that plunge them into ruin and destruction. 1 Tim 6:9

28. 12. It is a threat to our precious faith

a. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows. 1 Tim 6:10 (NLT)

29. 13. Our life may be full of problems

a. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows. 1 Tim 6:10

30. 14. It will disqualify one as an elder or deacon

a. So an elder must be a man whose life is above reproach. He must be faithful to his

wife. He must exercise self-control, live wisely, and have a good reputation. He must enjoy having guests in his home, and he must be able to teach. He must not be a heavy drinker or be violent. He must be gentle, not quarrelsome, and not love money. 1 Timothy 3:2-3 (NLT)

- 32. The love of money and greed are close relatives, and they are both enemies of our soul
- 33. 6 consequences of greed (covetousness)
- 34. Greed can plunge us into ruin and destruction
 - a. But people who long to be rich fall into temptation and are trapped by many foolish and harmful desires that plunge them into ruin and destruction. For the love of money is the root of all kinds of evil. And some people, craving money, have wandered from the true faith and pierced themselves with many sorrows. 1 Timothy 6:9-10 (NLT)
- 35. God will consider us a fool
 - a. Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; a man's life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions." And he told them this parable: "The ground of a certain rich man produced a good crop. He thought to himself, 'What shall I do? I have no place to store my crops.' "Then he said, 'This is what I'll do. I will tear down my barns and build bigger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. And I'll say to myself, "You have plenty of good things laid up for many years. Take life easy; eat, drink and be merry." "But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life will be demanded from you. Then who will get what you have prepared for yourself?" This is how it will be with anyone who stores up things for himself but is not rich toward God." Luke 12:15-21 (NIV)
- 36. Greed is a form of idolatry and may bring God's wrath on us
 - a. So put to death the sinful, earthly things lurking within you. Have nothing to do with sexual immorality, impurity, lust, and evil desires. Don't be greedy, for a greedy person is an idolater, worshiping the things of this world. Because of these sins, the anger of God is coming. Colossians 3:5-6 (NLT)
- 37. Greed may leave us unprepared to face God's coming judgement
 - a. They will throw their silver into the streets, and their gold will be an unclean thing. Their silver and gold will not be able to save them in the day of the LORD's wrath. They will not satisfy their hunger or fill their stomachs with it, for it has made them stumble into sin. Eze 7:19
- 38. Greed may blind us to heavenly values and cause us to waste our lives in the pursuit of worthless things
 - a. Turn my heart toward your statutes and not toward selfish gain. Turn my eyes away from worthless things; preserve my life according to your word. Psalm 119:36-37
- 39. Greed may cost us an inheritance in the kingdom of God,
 - a. You can be sure that no immoral, impure, or greedy person will inherit the Kingdom of Christ and of God. For a greedy person is an idolater, worshiping the things of this world. Eph 5:5 (NLT)
 - b. Don't you realize that those who do wrong will not inherit the Kingdom of God? Don't fool yourselves. Those who indulge in sexual sin, or who worship idols, or

commit adultery, or are male prostitutes, or practice homosexuality, or are thieves, or greedy people, or drunkards, or are abusive, or cheat people—none of these will inherit the Kingdom of God. 1 Cor 6:9-10 (NLT)
